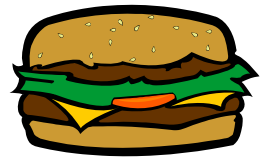


General Fiction Book Project "Book Sandwiches"



The Book:

- You may choose any type of appropriate fictional novel, as long as it has more than 100 pages.
- It may not be a book you have read before, and check with me to make sure it's not a book that we're going to read as a class this year.

The Book Requirements:

- You need to tell me the title and author of the book by **Friday, September 18th**.
- There is a calendar included in this packet and you should work with an adult at home to set up a good reading schedule, so that you know you can finish the book in time to actually work on the project. If it looks like you won't be able to fit all the reading in, then you may need to choose a different book.
- The book project is due on **Tuesday, October 20th**.

The Project:

- You will be making a "book sandwich."
- I will provide you with the "ingredients" for this project, but you may also make your own.
- If you make your own ingredients, make sure that each ingredient is at least the approximate size of a 6" square. It may be bigger, but please don't make it smaller.

The Sandwich Ingredients:

- TOP SLICE OF BREAD - Write the title and author of the book you read.
- LETTUCE - Write a short summary of the book.
- TOMATO - Write a detailed description of the book's main character.
- MAYONNAISE - Describe the book's setting (don't just say where it takes place).
- CHEESE - Pick at least 5 new words you found while reading the book and write a definition for each one.
- MEAT (roast beef, turkey, whatever) - Write about an important or pivotal part of the story and explain why it is important/pivotal.
- BOTTOM SLICE OF BREAD - Draw a picture of your favorite scene from the book and write a short caption at the bottom.

Project is due on Tuesday, October 20

Project Requirements:

- The descriptions you write on the ingredients should include as much information as you can think of. We will talk about this more in class, but there should not be one-sentence descriptions for these things.
- You may neatly *handwrite* or type on each of your ingredients.
 - If you are going to *handwrite* for your sandwich, the final version **MAY NOT** be in pencil. Please use a pen or a thin marker. You should plan everything out first, in pencil, before you go over it in pen/marker.
- You may want to write out what you are going to say on a sheet of scratch paper first and work with someone to help check for any mistakes (such as spelling or punctuation).
- You may add ingredients to your sandwich if you want, but you need to make sure you at least have the 7 ingredients I listed.
- Please cut the ingredients out of their sheets before you turn in the "sandwich."
- Please write your name on the back of the top slice of bread.
- Please don't write on the back of any of your other ingredients. If you need more space, add another "slice." I will have some extra ingredients for you if you need them.
- It's probably better if you don't give away the ending of the book. Hopefully, people will see your sandwich and want to read the book!
- If you are having any problems, please talk to me as soon as possible. Don't wait until the last minute! 😊
